I have tried to compile as complete a bibliography as possible, but — owing to the wide dispersion of the material — I may have overlooked some publications. If necessary, a supplement will be issued in the future.

Articles which appeared in daily newspapers or in similar popular publications are not included here.

Professor Michael Avi-Yonah was the editor, or joint editor, of many publications. In addition to those noted in their place in the bibliography (cf. index, below, s.v. *Editing*), we should mention: (a) *The Quarterly of the Department of Antiquities in Palestine* and other publications of that Department; (b) most of the publications of the Israel (formerly: Jewish Palestine) Exploration Society, including its *Bulletin* [Hebrew], several volumes of *Eretz-Israel* [Hebrew], and the *Israel Exploration Journal*; and (c) the sections 'Archaeology' and 'Topography' of the *Encyclopaedia Hebraica* [Hebrew].

We should also mention Avi-Yonah's compilation of the 'Bibliography of Excavations in Palestine' at the end of each volume of the *QDAP*, and the section 'Hebrew Books and Papers' in the *IEJ*.

The publications are listed in chronological order; articles in periodicals, which appear other than annually, are included under the year of publication of the number in which they were issued (although this date may differ from the date of publication of the entire volume).

Books are marked with an asterisk.

The analytical index below (pp. 312–315) refers, as a rule, to books and articles, but it also contains references to selected items in encyclopaedias.

I wish to thank Mrs. Eva Avi-Yonah, Miss Hannah Katzenstein and Miss Wanda Aftergood for their kind help in assembling the material.
