Chapter 1 Corpus

A considerable number of the cylinder seal impressions included in this corpus have not yet been published. In those cases where no permission has been received to publish the object, the impression was given a corpus number according to the type to which it belongs by our classification. Information is also given concerning the provenance, registration number, and present location of the object.*

Cylinder seal impressions were discovered at Beth-Yerah during the course of various excavations. The designation (B) following the name of the site indicates that the object discussed was discovered during Bar-Adon's excavations; the letters (K-D) — Kantor and Delougaz's excavation; the letter (M) — Mazar's excavation; and the letter (U) — Ussishkin's excavation. In the two cases where there is no designation following the name of the site the objects were discovered as accidental finds on the surface at Beth-Yerah.

Several impressions have been lost and their present location is unknown. The designation (x) following the corpus number of any object indicates that the present writer could not study the seal or impression at first hand. In these cases, the corpus data are derived from the publication of the object. In several cases a drawing or photograph, and in one case (IIC-4) a slide, is all that remains of the object; this is the reason for the poor quality of some of the photographs. In other cases, no photograph of the object was available.

In every case, information pertaining to the motifs and to the origin of the object is given. When the provenance is a comparatively unknown site, its map reference is also indicated. All other data concerning registration number, present location, dimensions, material, and publication, are presented only when available.

The use of the term "material" instead of "impressed on" indicates that the object discussed is a seal and not a seal impression.

The term "dimensions" refers in every case to the dimensions of the seal. Since the majority of the seals were not preserved, the seal's dimensions were calculated by its impression. Whenever a personal examination of the seal or impression was possible, the dimensions are those taken by the writer; otherwise, they have been derived from the publication. In several cases where the diameter of the seal has been calculated by the length of the scene which appears in the seal's impression, this dimension will be preceded by the term "approx."

The scale of the drawings and photographs is 1:1 unless otherwise stated. The drawings of the seals and impressions are the work of Mrs. Ester Hoover and Mrs. Mika Sarig of the Institute of Archaeology, the Hebrew University, Jerusalem. IIA-5 was drawn by Mrs. Judy Hammond, New York. The following photographs were taken from the publications of the objects: IA-1,2,3; IB-2; IC-1; IF-1; IIA-1,2,3; IIBb-2; IIBb-3; IIIB-4; IIIC-5; X-1. 


