## ASHURBANIPAL TEXTS IN THE COLLECTION OF THE ORIENTAL INSTITUTE, UNIVERSITY OF CHICAGO

#### INTRODUCTION

The catalogue of the Ashurbanipal texts in the collection of the Oriental Institute of the University of Chicago represents the completion of a task undertaken by A. C. Piepkorn almost sixty years ago. In 1928, several hundred cuneiform texts were purchased by E. Chiera in Mosul, from a local dealer, and it can hardly be doubted that they originated from clandestine digging at Nineveh during the excavations of R. Campbell Thompson at the site.¹ Once in Chicago, these texts were assigned to Piepkorn for study. The fact that the fragments have consecutive museum registration numbers and that they are grouped, for the most part, according to the editions of the annals of Ashurbanipal, corroborates Piepkorn's statement that he had "examined and transliterated" all the texts.² In AS 5, the first volume of a planned two-part study on the historical prisms of Ashurbanipal, he published editions E, B, D, and K, utilizing 92 fragments in the Oriental Institute, numbered A 7919-8010. The second volume, which was to treat the remaining fragments of the original lot,

A 8011-8163, was never published<sup>3</sup>; it is the texts of that second part of the collection which are described in the catalogue which follows.<sup>4</sup>

In addition to these texts, Piepkorn acquired fifteen fragments for himself while in Mosul in April, 1933; these fragments remained in his possession until his death, at which time his widow transferred them to the Oriental Institute, where they were accessioned as A 11858-70.5 A further ten items, A 11848-57, purchased by Chiera, belong to this same group.

H. Tadmor studied these texts in Chicago during the years 1956-57 and 1971, and was assigned publication rights. In the initial stage of the work, Tadmor reconstructed Ashurbanipal Prism F, the fragments of which are so well represented in the second part of the collection. However, the publication by J.-M. Aynard of an almost complete exemplar of this edition of the annals obviated the need for a separate publication of the Chicago texts.<sup>6</sup> M. Cogan studied all of the collection in 1978 and 1980, especially the Prism F fragments.<sup>7</sup>

Most of the texts are fragments of numerous manuscripts of Ashurbanipal Prism F (51%). The rest are divided among prism and cylinder fragments of editions B, D, K, C, A, H (a single fragment), and several small pieces that have not been identified. It turned out that a few stray fragments belong to the inscriptions of other Assyrian kings, Sennacherib and Esarhaddon.

One gathers that Piepkorn had prepared a full manuscript of all the Ashurbanipal fragments, this from the numerous cross-references on the margin and in the footnotes throughout AS 5 to the fragments of editions F, C, and A. Compare his remarks in JAOS 52 (1932) 304. At the suggestion of I. J. Gelb, H. Tadmor visited Professor Piepkorn at Concordia Theological Seminary, St. Louis, in 1957, and discussed the possibility of a joint publication of the remaining fragments. But Piepkorn stated that he had left the field of Assyriology and could not locate the manuscript and the materials he had prepared some twenty years earlier.

Two additional texts, which are nowhere recorded as being in Piepkorn's private collection, were copied by Freedman (nos. 29-30); these are not registered with the others in the Oriental Institute.

In his dissertation and in a subsequent unpublished manuscript, Freedman prepared a new edition of Prism C which incorporated several of the fragments in the present catalogue. These and other fragments were studied by M. Cogan and H. Tadmor, Or NS 50 (1981) 229-40, in connection with their work on Prism K.
